 - India VIX is an index that serves measure of market as expectation of volatility in the near term. Simply put, while volatility signifies the rate and magnitude of change in the stock price or index (value, movement in the VIX index reflects the overall market volatility expectations over the next 30 days. So, a spike in the VIX value means the market is expecting higher volatility in the near future.
 - India VIX index is not the first of its kind in the world.
 - The VIX index was first created by the Chicago Board Options

 Exchange (CBOE) and introduced in 1993 based on the prices of S&P 500 index.
 - ❖ Since then, it has become a globally-recognised gauge of volatility in the U.S equity markets. The India VIX was launched with a similar intent in 2010 and is based on the computation methodology of CBOE though amended to align with the Indian markets.
 - ❖ In the current calendar year, the India VIX index has jumped fivefold, from around 12 levels to the current 67 levels, which clearly hints that the market perceives that volatility will only increase in the coming days.



- ❖ Incidentally, the index is currently trading at record highs and on some days in the recent past, saw a surge of more than 20% in a single day.



Kharif Crops

- ★ The word "Kharif" is Arabic for autumn since the season coincides with the beginning of autumn or winter.
- ★ Kharif crops also are known as monsoon crops. These are the crops that are cultivated in the monsoon season.
- → The Kharif season differs in every state of the country but is generally from June to September. These crops are usually sown at the beginning of the monsoon season around June and harvested by September or October.
- + Rice, maize, bajra, ragi, soybean, groundnut, cotton are all Kharif types crops.

Rabi Crops

- → The Arabic translation of the word "Rabi" is **spring**. These crops' harvesting happens in the springtime hence the name.
- ★ The Rabi season usually starts in November and lasts up to March or April. Rabi crops are mainly cultivated using irrigation since monsoons are already over by November. In fact, unseasonal showers in November or December can ruin the crops.
- → The seeds are sown at the beginning of autumn, which results in a spring harvest.
- + Wheat, barley, mustard and green peas are some of the major rabi types of crops that grow in India.

- Move follows Union Budget certain announcement that specified categories of government bonds would be opened fully for non-resident investors without any restrictions.
- FPIs, Non-Resident Indians Overseas Citizens of India and other entities permitted to invest in Government Securities under the Debt Regulations can invest under this route.
- However, these securities will continue to be eligible for investment by residents. For FPIs the earlier limit of investment in G-secs (6%) has not been changed.
- This is first step towards Indian G-Secs being listed on global bond indices to access cheap liquidity in the overseas markets.
- It will help bring in stable foreign investment in government bonds, as a result more domestic capital would be available for industry as crowding out to that extent would be reduced.

Government securities

G-Sec is a tradable instrument issued by Central Government or State Governments. It acknowledges the Government's debt obligation.

❖ The recovering ozone hole might have been a result of the 1987 Montreal Protocol. Study notes that ozone depletion triggered a change in atmospheric circulation.


Ozone depletion cools the stratospheric air (when it's intact, the ozone layer absorbs UV light, which warms the stratosphere), strengthening the winds of polar vortex and affecting winds down to lowest layer of Earth's atmosphere.

❖ Ultimately, ozone depletion has shifted the mid-latitude jet stream and dry regions at the edge of tropics toward South Pole.

Ozone layer in stratosphere keeps out harmful ultraviolet radiation from sun.

 - ❖ The Ministry of Home Affairs issued the Jammu and Kashmir Reorganisation (Adaptation of State Laws) Order, 2020. through which it amended 109 laws and repealed 29 laws of the erstwhile State and inserted the 'domicile clause' in the Jammu and Kashmir Civil Services Decentralisation and Recruitment Act, 2010.
 - ❖ Under the 2010 Act, the clause for "permanent resident of the State" has been substituted by "Domicile" of the Union Territory.
 - The Act pertained to employment in the civil services, comprising "district, divisional and State" cadre posts. Only permanent residents of J&K were eligible to apply for the gazetted and nongazetted posts. The amendment allows non-domiciles to apply to these posts.
 - ❖ The domicile status applies to "children of such residents of J&K who reside outside J&K in connection with their employment or business or other professional or vocational reasons but their parents should fulfil any of the conditions provided".

 - * "Based on the review and empirical analysis of CCyB indicators, it has been decided that it is not necessary to activate CCyB for a period of one year or earlier, as may be necessary," the RBI said.
 - Counter Cyclical Capital buffer is the capital to be kept by a bank to meet business cycle related risks.
 - ❖ It is aimed to protect the banking sector against losses from changes in economic conditions. Banks may face difficulties in phases like recession when the loan amount doesn't return.







Mendelian disorders-

- Mendelian disorders are mainly determined by alteration or mutation in the single gene. These disorders are transmitted to the offspring on the same lines.
- Most common and prevalent Mendelian disorders are Haemophilia, Cystic fibrosis, Sickle-cell anaemia, Colour blindness, Phenylketonuria, Thalassemia, etc.
- Mendelian disorders may be dominant or recessive.

* The chromosomal disorders

- The chromosomal disorders on the other hand are caused due to absence or excess or abnormal arrangement of one or more chromosomes.
- Failure of segregation of chromatids during cell division cycle results in the gain or loss of a chromosome(s), called



- aneuploidy. For example, Down's syndrome results in the gain of extra copy of chromosome 21. Similarly, Turner's syndrome results loss of due to an chromosome in human females.
- Failure of cytokinesis after telophase stage of cell division results in an increase in a whole set of chromosomes in an organism and, this phenomenon is known as **polyploidy.** This condition is often seen in plants.
- The total number of chromosomes in a normal human cell is 46 (23 pairs).
 Out of these 22 pairs are autosomes and one pair of chromosomes are sex chromosome.







- Scientists of Indian Institute of Technology (IIT), Jodhpur have the neuroinvasive explored nature of the COVID 19 virus SARS-CoV-2 highlighting that loss of smell and taste of infected patients makes their entire Central Nervous System (CNS) and the underlying structures in the brain more prone to viral infection with devastating effects.
- * They have attributed the loss of smell or taste to the fact that nose and mouth both are very important entry points of the virus, which then may be slowly making its way to the olfactory bulb using the neurons of the olfactory mucosa. The olfactory bulb located in the forebrain is the structure that is chiefly responsible for the sense of **smell**. This explains the loss of smell associated with many asymptomatic carriers of COVID-19 and also may be exposing the CNS to viral infection.
- ❖ The paper also rings warning bells to the asymptomatic carriers of COVID-19 with anosmia (loss of smell) and ageusia (loss of taste) to selfquarantine themselves as soon as they feel these and consult specialized nephrologists before they turn into carriers. It also suggests brain autopsies COVID-19 infected patients and analysis of their cerebrospinal fluid.
